PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND EXPERIENCE

- A bachelor's degree in a specific music education/performance medium or concentration of experience in choral arts/vocal arts is required; advanced degree preferred
- An understanding of best practices in music education, developmentally appropriate repertoire, vocal technique, and sufficient piano skills to facilitate rehearsals
- A demonstrated ability and desire to incorporate choral/vocal music into a broader, collaborative performance process.
- Ability to cover two distinct styles of music in a one-semester format
- A demonstrated passion for instruction and inspiring students
- Ability to integrate technology and use innovative curricula
- Understanding of the developmental needs of middle school students
- Ability to differentiate instruction when necessary to reach all levels of learners
- Collaborative spirit in developing curricula and teaching methods, both within the department and across other disciplines
- Flexibility, optimism, creativity, high expectations, and a growth mindset
- Enthusiastic involvement in the school community for the winter vocal concert
- Proven positive working relationships with colleagues, students, and families
- Excellent communication skills, both written and oral
- Proven organizational skills
- Understanding of independent schools preferred.

ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES AS REQUIRED

- Teach one ensemble class in a four-day block rotation (two or three classes per week).
- Maintain a gradebook and prepare grades and comments at the end of each quarter
