Xenophiles, Spanish Club, etc.</p> <p>AND Participate in one of the following academic competitions: ex.) KUNA, Academic World Quest, etc.</p>	<p>Must complete at least 30 hours of community service with a local organization that has a global component. (ex. KRM, La Casita)</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Complete a summer internship (minimum of 10 hours per week. with a business or organization that has an international component, serves a global market, or works with a local immigrant community.</p>	<p>Attend a total of 8 lectures over four years plus a program write up for each lecture.</p> <p>NOTE: At least two of the lectures must be in person at the WAC, some can be done online, and a student can choose to attend a lecture at Bellarmine, U of L or another local group approved by the Ms. Podbilski, the GC Program Coordinator.</p>	<p>Attend or participate in one event with an international focus. (maybe local or outside of Louisville)</p> <p>Examples: - WorldFest - Festival of Faith - Americana Festival - We Day</p>	<p>Direct international experience, such as one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -International student exchange program -Hosting an international student -Travel abroad program or educational tour -Regular direct engagement with individuals from other countries/cultures via classroom or other structured forums. 	<p>Program citizens will complete a project, reflection, and presentation that demonstrates an understanding of global citizenship and how the local community is connected globally. Students must spend a minimum of 20-30 hours on the project. The culminating event is a capstone defense, in which the citizen will make a ten-minute presentation to a panel of instructors.</p>
